Embarkation details	Unit embarked from Melbourne, Victoria, on board HMAT A34 <i>Persic</i> on 22nd November 1915. Disembarked Suez on 21st December 1915 and proceeded to join the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force the same day.

Unit from Nominal Roll	6th Field Artillery Brigade.
1916 26th January	Admitted to No 5 Field Ambulance, Tel el Kebir, and transferred to No 2 Australian General Hospital, Ghezerieh, the same day with Pyrexia (high fever) of unknown origin.
1916 9th February	Discharged to Overseas Base, Cairo.
1916 7th March	Rejoined 6th Australian Field Artillery Brigade, Ismailia.
1916 15th March	Re-mustered as a Driver.
1916 17th March	Embarked Alexandria to join the British Expeditionary Force at Marseilles, France, 23rd March 1916.
1916 22nd October	Rejoined unit attached to 2nd Australian Divisional Artillery Headquarters.
1917 26th January	Admitted to No 8 Australian Field Ambulance with diarrhoea. Discharged 1st February 1917 and rejoined unit on 2nd February 1917.
1917 26th July -15th August	On leave to United Kingdom.
1918 24th April	Wounded in action. (Gassed) Admitted to No 11 Australian Field Ambulance on 24th April 1918, and transferred to No 4 Casualty Clearing Station the same day. Then to No 9 General Hospital, Rouen on 25th April 1918. To England on 28th April 1918 then to Reading War Hospital on 30th April 1918 (gassed, slight). Transferred to No 3 Australian Auxiliary Hospital, Dartford on 17th June 1918 then to No 1 Australian Auxiliary Hospital, Harefield, 6th July 1918.
1918 6th August	Discharged to furlough, marched into No 4 Command Depot, Hurdcott on 20th August 1918.
1918 17th October	Found guilty of neglecting to obey an order. Awarded 2 days confined to barracks.
1918 16th November	Found guilty of being absent without leave from 2400 hours on 12th November 1918 until 1830 hours on 15th November 1918. Awarded 4 days Field Punishment No 2 and forfeits 4 days pay.
1918 30th November	Marched into Australian Army Medical Corps Training Depot.
1918 2nd December	Attached to No 2 Group Clearing Hospital. Marched into Australian Army Medical Corps Training Depot, 9th December 1918.
1918 12th December	Marched into No 2 Command Depot.
Fate	Returned to Australia 25th March 1919 on board HT <i>Port Denison</i> . Disembarked Melbourne, 10th May 1919.
Other details	Discharged on 24th September 1919 in Melbourne (medically unfit). Medals: 1914-15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Died on the 9 August 1963 at the age of 79. Buried in Bendigo Cemetery, Victoria. Connection with Monbulk unknown.
