Embarkation details	At embarkation at Port Melbourne, his papers were missing. Returned to camp and on fresh attestation was attached to 2nd Reinforcements, 21st Battalion. Unit embarked from Melbourne, Victoria, on board HMAT A64 <i>Demosthenes</i> on 16 July 1915
Unit from Nominal Roll	24th Battalion
1915 10th January	In Mudros Egypt hospital. Heliopolis 46 days
1915 August - December	With the 24th on Gallipoli until evacuation.
1916 29th June	Absent from duty 57 days sick to the 20th July 1916.
1916 1st July	AWL several times in Tel-el-Kebir, England, Larkhill, Rolleston and Havre over the next year.
1917 3rd July	Rejoined Unit in France
1917 4th October	Wounded in action. Admitted to hospital in the Field Gun Shot Wound to the left arm and face.
1917 13th October	Transferred to England in hospital.
1918 27th March	To hospital in Fovant. Cellulitis. Still being treated for Gun shot wound to left arm also jaundice and prolonged gall bladder trouble.
Fate	Returned to Australia 24 August 1918 on S.S. <i>Medic</i> via Panama Canal.
1919 January	Long surgical treatment in Caulfield Hospital.
Other details	Discharged 16th November 1918 Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Born 1893 in England - Came to relatives in Monbulk (James and Emily Jane Rampton - farmer - <i>Aust. Electrol Roll 1903 &amp; 1924</i> ) some years previous to 1914. Described as 5 ft., 5in., 10 stone 4 lb., grey eyes and dark grey hair.
