1917 3rd May	Wounded in Action at Bullecourt. Gun shot wound to right arm. Evacuated to Hospital Rouen. Then to Richmond Hospital, England.
1918 21st June	Rejoined Unit in France.
1918 31st July	To hospital - sick for 87 days.
Fate	Returned to Australia on S.S. ' <i>Miltiades</i> ' 19 June 1919
Other details	Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Born 1881 to May Adeline Collins and Francis Charles Cutten Described as 5 ft., 10 in., 143 lb., brown eyes and brown hair. Married Blanche Gill in 1907 Died 1954
