1918 21st March	To hospital sick Diarrhea. In and out of hospital.
1919 9th April	Returned to Base then returned to England 15th April.
Fate	Returned to Australia 27 May 1919 per <i>Rio Pardo</i> . Disembarking in Adelaide.
Other details	Discharged 17th July 1919. Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Born 1879 in Yorkshire England to Eva <i>nee</i> Wilkinson and Frederick Gill. Described as 5 ft., 4½ in., 125 lb., hazel eyes and dark brown hair. Died 24th August 1951 aged 72. Buried in Ferntree Gully Cemetery.
