1916 14th September	Arrived Plymouth.
1916 26th December	Marched in to Wareham.
1917 23rd March	Taken on strength. Transferred to 65th, 57th and 67th Battalions over the following months.
1917 17th July	Admitted to 17th Field Ambulance - sick.
1917 21st July	Returned to duty.
1917 25th August	Proceeded to France to rejoin 37th Battalion on 31st August at Rouelles.
1917 1st September	Taken on strength.
1917 4th October	Wounded in Action. Admitted with gun shot wound to right leg and transferred to England and admitted to Birmingham War Hospital 20th October then transferred to 3rd Auxiliary Hospital on 7th November.
1917 9th November	Discharged from hospital and granted furlough until 23rd November.
1917 15th December	Attached for duty to Admin headquarters in London then to Central Registry to kit store Fulham with 37th Battalion.
1918 4th January	Marched into No. 2 Comm. Depot Weymouth.
Fate	Returned to Australia 13th May 1918 per ' <i>Dunvegan Castle</i> ' disembarked at Melbourne on 14th June 1918.
Other details	Medals: 1914-15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Born 1872 in Garston, England to Elizabeth <i>nee</i> Hornby and Oliver Harbord. Described as 5 ft., 9 1/2 in., 10 stone 9lb., blue eyes and mid brown hair. Hugh first enlisted on 6th July 1915. Between the 14th July 1915 - 12th December 1915. He was in the 8th & 12th Battalions and the 15th Company then he deserted. He rejoined on the 7th July 1916. Discharged on 9th November 1918. Disability - gun shot wound to thigh. His home contact was C/- Mr W. Bowman, Monbulk Victoria. 1919 Electrol Roll listed him as living in Monbulk and occupation as Orchardist. Died 1940 in Albert Park, Victoria. Aged 65
