Married Clara Rockett 1920 Died on 9th May 1967 at Atherton Cemetery, Queensland aged 84
Sons and Daughters on Active Service World War Two	1. Son Flight Lieutenant W.B. Martin. Enlisted Cairns, Queensland for R.A.A.F. 1940. Embarked from Sydney for Canada June 1941. Under Air Training Scheme in Canada. Landed in England with training completed October 1941. Posted to 460 Squadron (Europe) 20th December 1942. Awarded Distinguished Flying Cross - July 1943. Left England for Australia, September 1944. Arrived Australia, December 1944. Posted Bairnsdale, Victoria - February 1945. Discharged - 3rd July 1945.  2. Daughter 267370 Gunner J.B. Martin (Jean) A.W.A.S. Enlisted December 1942. Discharged 1946. Served two years with No.9 Anti-Aircraft Operations Room in Townsville - then transferred L.H.2 Signals, Melbourne.
