1918 9th February	Granted leave rejoined Unit in the Field 24th February.
1918 29th September	Wounded in Action. A small shrapnel wound to the chest. After treatment remained on duty.
1919 11th February	Granted leave until 17th February.
1919 26th April	Marched out of France arriving Codford, England on 28th April
Fate	Returned to Australia 23 September 1919 per S.S. 'Ascanius'. Disembarking Melbourne on 10th November 1919.
Other details	Never absent from Battalion from its formation, February 1916 to its disbandment at St. Mascent, France July 1919. (Excepting on leave or off duty). Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Discharged on 23rd September 1919 Described as 5 ft., 8 in., fair complexion, blue eyes and fair hair. Born 1897 to Martha <i>nee</i> Kenny and Thomas Richard Wilson Martin.
World War 2	No. N 350810 Lieutenant R. B. Martin 27th Battalion V.D.C. Served 1939 to 1945. Died 7th October 1982.
Sons and Daughters on Active Service World War Two	1. Daughter Edna Martin. Enlisted A.W.A.S., Melbourne 1943. Failed to pass medical test. Served in Dept. of Munitions until end of war.
