1916 21st February	Transferred to hospital in Cairo Egypt with mild Synovitis. Later deemed medically unfit with chronic Synovitis in the right knee.
Fate	Returned to Australia per HMAT <i>Argyllshire</i> on 30th March 1916
Other details	Discharged in Melbourne 17th June 1916. After discharge became member of Australian Instructional Corps and Area Instructor at Warrnambool, Victoria. Later resigned and accepted position of Secretary to the Victorian Rifle Association, Melbourne until 1939 when he resigned to join up in World War Two. Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Born 1885 in Melbourne to Henrietta <i>nee</i> Moxham and William McGill. (Farmer in Monbulk 1903 & 1909 Electrol Roll. William died in Monbulk in 1911) 2nd marriage to Norma Kendall Asprey in 1944. Died in Sydney N.S.W. 1948/1949.
Active Service during World War Two	29th November 1939 appointed Lieut on Area Staff of Southern Command. 24/11/1941 transferred to Director of Ordnance Service A.H.2 as Ordnance Officer. 20/10/1942 2.M. with Head Quarters, 2nd Australian Army. 04/06/1944 retired through ill health.
