1915 April	Volunteered with his Regiment, as dismounted Light Horse Infantry, for service in Gallipoli. Landed on Gallipoli.
1915 4th June	Killed in Action on Gallipoli in infantry assault on enemy trenches. (Reported only three survivors and those wounded from the assault).
Fate	Killed in Action 4th June 1915
Other details	Buried at Shrapnel Valley Cemetery (Plot IV, Row A, Grave No. 39), Gallipoli, Turkey. Panel No., Roll of Honour, Australian War Memorial 4. Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Born 19th March 1874 to Amelia Priscella nee Cameron and Andrew Lulum Paul. Andrew Cameron Paul is shown on the 1903 Electrol Roll as a farmer in Monbulk, District of Mernda. Married Ada Miriam Cowman on 6th December 1905 at Northcote. Ada became an inmate of the Mental Hospital Parkside. Their children all became wards of the State in Adelaide 17th July 1922. Died 4th June 1915
