1916 13th December	Proceeded overseas to France.
1916 14th December	Admitted to hospital in Boulogne, France with Tonsillitis. Rejoined Unit 4th February
1917 5th February	Taken on strength
1917 9th May	Admitted to hospital at Wimereux with Trench Fever then to convalescence camp at Boulogne until rejoining his Unit in the Field on 14th August.
1917 8th October	To Hospital sick (Pyrexia - fever of unknown origin) Transferred to Ambulance Train to Etaples.
1917 20th November	Rejoined Unit in Belgium.
1917 31st December	On leave in Belgium until 17th January 1918
1918 7th April	Wounded in Action. Gassed. Evacuated to Hospital at Havre 28th April.
1918 9th July	To Base Detail ex - wounded.
1919 23rd February	Admitted to 4th Scott General Hospital in Glasgow with Influenza whilst on leave from France. Discharged on 5th April.
1919 7th April	Granted leave in England.
Fate	Returned to Australia 15th May 1919 per <i>Ypringa</i>
Other details	War service: Western Front Medals: 1914 - 15 Star, British War Medal, Victory Medal Discharged 29th December 1919 medically unfit - Gassed Son of Janet <i>nee</i> Gallan and Angus Shaw Married Laura Bertha Godfrey. Died 29th September 1965
